The Twinning Association's purpose is to facilitate and support European links for local clubs, schools and organisations. It is an independent organisation and meets six times a year to review and plan activities. All of its members are volunteers, supported by one part-time member of staff.

Any Rushmoor resident, member of a club, organisation, society or school can become a member and have a say in twinning activities and how they are organised.

The Association receives no funding and relies solely on its own efforts to fundraise and bid for grants.



The Twinning Association raised £1675 and £335 was used to help host groups visiting Rushmoor.

SOME HIGHLIGHTS

Many visits and exchanges took place over the year (an average of two per month), with participation from at least 350 Rushmoor residents. Hundreds of others were involved in the form of audiences, school communities, host families and helpers.
